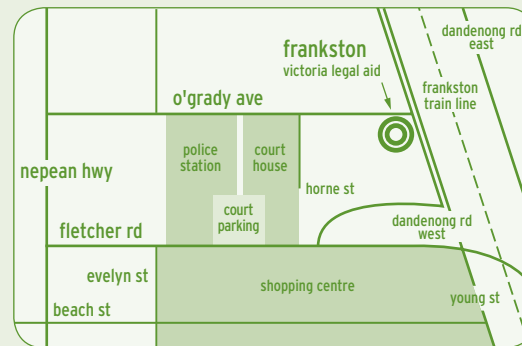

About our services

We have 15 offices in Victoria, which are open Monday to Friday, 8.45 am to 5.15 pm.

Victoria Legal Aid can help you with criminal matters, family breakdown, family violence, child support, immigration, social security, mental health, discrimination, guardianship and administration, tenancy, debt and traffic offences.

Our free legal services include:

- information over the phone
- seminars and workshops
- legal advice across Victoria, including most courts and tribunals.

We also give grants of legal assistance to people who can not afford a lawyer.

Victoria Legal Aid's Peninsula office

Our office in Frankston offers a range of legal services to the Peninsula region.

Free legal advice

Our lawyers can help you with:

- criminal charges
- family law matters
- child support matters
- general legal advice and information.

We hold legal advice sessions about many legal problems every Monday from 1.30 pm to 4.00 pm, and Fridays from 10.00 am to 12.30 pm. These sessions are drop-in only and you do not need to make an appointment.

Family law matters are by appointment only. Call us on 9784 5222 to make an appointment.

We also visit other towns in the area. You can make an appointment for free legal advice at:

- Mornington Information Centre on 5975 1644
- Southern Peninsula Community Support and Information Centre on 5986 1285.

If your matter is urgent or you cannot easily get to the office, we may be able to give you legal advice over the phone.

When you come to your appointment, please bring:

- all paperwork
- any records of interviews with police
- pay slips and/or Health Care Card
- bank statements.

If you are not able to keep the appointment please give us 24 hours notice.

Lawyers at court

It is important that you get legal advice before you go to court.

However, if you do not have a lawyer, we have lawyers at many courts and tribunals across Victoria. These 'duty lawyers' help people who have a court hearing on the day. They may be able to speak for you in court.

For criminal law matters, we have duty lawyers at:

- Frankston Magistrates' Court every day of the week
- Dromana Magistrates' Court on every second Thursday.

For family law matters we have duty lawyers at the Family Court at Dandenong every Thursday.

Many people want to see the duty lawyer, so we may not be able to help everyone. We have to help some people first.

This includes:

- serious cases, including people in jail or people at risk of going into jail
- cases involving children
- people who cannot afford legal help
- people who could not get legal advice before going to court.

Ask staff at the court or tribunal if a duty lawyer is available.

Legal representation

If you need ongoing help from a lawyer, we can help you if you have a grant of legal assistance. We may also support you if you are going to the Mental Health Review Board.

Grants of legal assistance

A grant of legal assistance is money used to pay a Victoria Legal Aid lawyer or a private lawyer to help you with your legal problem. A lawyer can:

- give you legal advice
- help you reach agreement
- prepare legal documents
- speak for you in court.

Getting a grant will depend on your financial situation and your legal problem. Grants are generally for criminal or family matters, but can be for some civil cases, such as discrimination, immigration, social security or mental health matters.

A grant is not always free. The amount you may have to pay depends on your financial situation.
