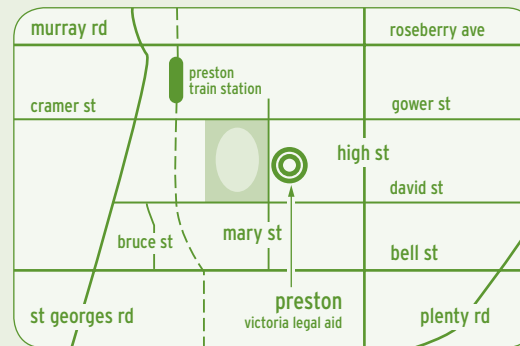

Victoria Legal Aid's north eastern suburbs office

Our office in Preston offers a range of legal services to the north eastern suburbs region.

Free legal advice

We have lawyers who can talk to you about how the law applies to your legal problem and what you may be able to do about it.

Our lawyers can help you with:

- criminal charges
- family law matters
- child support matters
- general legal advice and information.

Call us on 9416 6444 to make an appointment or drop in to our office at Preston. We also offer free legal advice at Epping (call our Preston office to make an appointment).

We run these free clinics every week (no appointment needed):

- criminal and civil law, Tuesdays 1.30 pm – 4.30 pm
- family law, Wednesdays 9.30 am – 11.30 am.

If your matter is urgent or you cannot easily get to the office, we may be able to give you legal advice over the phone.

When you come to your appointment, please bring:

- all paperwork
- any records of interviews with police
- pay slips and/or Health Care Card
- bank statements.

If you are not able to keep the appointment please give us 24 hours notice.

Lawyers at court

It is important that you get legal advice before you go to court.

However, if you do not have a lawyer, we have lawyers at many courts and tribunals across Victoria. These 'duty lawyers' help people who have a court hearing on the day. They may be able to speak for you in court.

We have duty lawyers at the:

- Heidelberg Magistrates' Court
- Heidelberg Family Violence Court
- Heidelberg Children's Court.

Many people want to see the duty lawyer, so we may not be able to help everyone. We have to help some people first.

This includes:

- serious cases, including people in jail or people at risk of going into jail
- cases involving children
- people who cannot afford legal help
- people who could not get legal advice before going to court.

Ask staff at the court or tribunal if a duty lawyer is available.

Legal representation

If you need ongoing help from a lawyer, we can help you if you have a grant of legal assistance. We may also support you if you are going to the Mental Health Review Board.

Grants of legal assistance

A grant of legal assistance is money used to pay a Victoria Legal Aid lawyer or a private lawyer to help you with your legal problem. A lawyer can:

- give you legal advice
- help you reach agreement
- prepare legal documents
- speak for you in court.

Getting a grant will depend on your financial situation and your legal problem. Grants are generally for criminal or family matters, but can be for some civil cases, such as discrimination, immigration, social security or mental health matters.

A grant is not always free. The amount you may have to pay depends on your financial situation.
