Sex and consent

Things to remember

- Consent means free and voluntary agreement it's a shared understanding between both people.
- Actively checking for consent before any kind of sexual activity is always your responsibility.
- Anyone can take back consent at any time no matter how far they've gone.
- Sexual penetration without consent is rape it's a serious crime
- Sexual assault covers other sexual acts without consent – it's a serious crime.
- A person can't consent to sex if they're outside the age of consent, asleep, unconscious or so affected by drugs or alcohol they have no way of freely and voluntarily agreeing.
- Healthy relationships need consent, respect and communication.
