## Sexting, selfies and nudes

## Things to remember

- It is illegal to threaten to distribute a sext (intimate image) of someone, including a digitally altered image.
- It is illegal to send on, post or share a sext of someone else who is under 18.
- If you're 18 or over you will break the law if you make, keep, ask for or send a sext of anyone under 18.
- If you're under 18 and you're in Victoria you can make, keep or send a sext of yourself.
- If you're under 18 and you're in Victoria you can keep a sext of someone else – but there are rules.
   The sext must not show any crimes or have anyone in it who is more than two years younger than you.
- National laws against taking, sending or keeping a sext of anyone under 18 can also apply in some cases.
- Received a sext? Delete it. Created a sext?
  Delete it. Sent a sext? Ask others to delete it.
